Streetlight Conversion Program

In May 2011 the Nova Scotia Government passed the "Province of Nova Scotia Energy Saving Roadway Lighting Act." In essence what this means is that all highway light fixtures in the province must be converted to new Light Emitting Diode (L.E.D.) technology over the next few years. This is a new energy efficient lighting technology that is intended to provide a significant reduction in power costs and in greenhouse gas emissions over the lifetime of the fixtures.

Municipalities like ours have been given the option of continuing on a status quo basis, and letting NSPI own, operate and maintain all the streetlights in our Municipality, or to take ownership and responsibility for the acquisition, conversion and maintenance of these L.E.D. fixtures ourselves.

Our Council has recently made the decision that it would be in our best interest to own our own L.E.D. streetlights. In the coming months staff will be putting together the detailed plan for making this transition and meeting the government legislated conversion requirements. We thank you for your patience and cooperation during this transition period.

Canada Post New Mailing Addresses

Canada Post will be implementing the official use of civic mailing addresses October 21st, 2013 for all residents and businesses served by rural route (Yarmouth RR1-RR5, South Ohio RR1 & RR2, Kemptville RR1, Carleton RR1) including customers served by PO Box at Kemptville, Hebron and Port Maitland Post Offices. With the implementation of civic mailing addresses customers will use their street number and name, the name of their community (where they actually live) a province identifier and a postal code. Rural Route numbers will no longer be required.

Prior to the conversion, Canada Post will contact you in writing with additional details including the exact date you should start using your civic address. Until that time, nothing is changing and it is important that you continue to use your current mailing address.

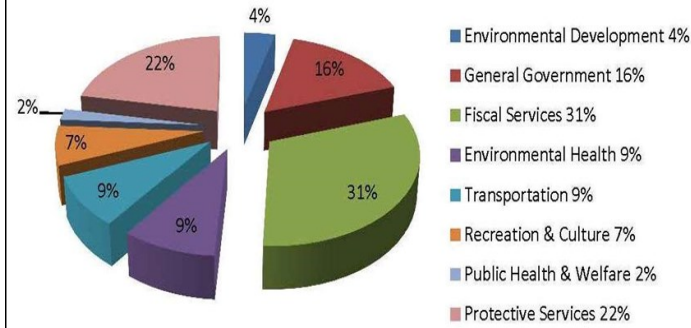

Where do my Tax Dollars Go?



4% - Environmental Development: Planning and Zoning; the Hebron Industrial Park & the Industrial Commission.

16% - General Government: Council Expenses; Administration, Salaries, Office & Building Expenses, Legal, Grants to Organizations, Information Technology, Financial Audit, Assessment Services, Lighthouse Property, Liability Insurance.

31% - Fiscal Services: Education, Mariners Centre, Regional Library, Principal & Interest, Long Term Debt.

9% - Environmental Health: Garbage collection and disposal, Sewage collection and treatment.

9% - Transportation: Yarmouth Airport, Public Transportation Studies, Public Works and Sidewalk Maintenance, Roads.

7% - Recreation & Culture: Recreation Programs, Recreation Department.

2% - Public Health & Welfare: Physician Recruitment & Medical Clinics, Seniors Housing.

22% - Protective Services: RCMP, Correctional Services, Fire Departments, Emergency Measures (EMO), Property Inspection, Animal and Pest Control, Subdivision and By-Law Administration.

Property Tax Rebate for Seniors

The Property Tax Rebate for Seniors Program, administered by Access Nova Scotia on behalf of the Department of Community Services, is designed to help eligible seniors by providing them with an annual rebate on their municipal property taxes. The program provides eligible homeowners with a rebate (determined by the Provincial Government.) on their municipal property taxes paid the previous year.
